INSIDE the WRITER'S MIND



Imagine that you are sat on a train, when you see someone approaching you to sit down opposite.

"I spot them on the train..."



IDEATION

Describe this character from your perspective. Make notes on:

- their clothes
- their face and expressions
- what they're carrying
- how they walk and sit down
- anything unusual

Now add how you feel – or how your narrator feels – about this person sitting opposite. Curious? Scared? Annoyed? Judgemental? Make notes on your narrator's internal feelings and responses. What does your narrator think the other person thinks of them?

Let's move the scene into some action. Does your narrator start a conversation with them? Or the other way around?

Perhaps something else happens that catches you both up in some drama.

What happens next?

WRITING & EDITING



Write those sections up into a flowing narrative, from your narrator noticing and describing the other person, to their inner thoughts, and then into the action that develops the story.



Now go back over your writing, checking it makes sense. Especially look out for:

- Have you over-described the character? (Just a couple of accurate, interesting) sentences leaves more to the reader's imagination!)
- Does the narrator's character come through? How do they speak to themselves?
- Is the action clear could anyone reading this follow what happens?
